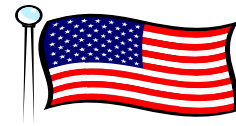




### **O' CANADA**

### **FLAG PROTOCOL**

When three flags, including the Canadian flag, are to be flown on a given occasion, the Canadian flag occupies the centre staff. The flag of the country being honoured occupies the left-hand staff, from the viewpoint of the audience facing the flags, and the third flag flies from the right-hand staff. All three flags should be at the same height and should be of equal size.

When used on a speaker's platform the flag, if displayed flat should be displayed above and behind the speaker.

When displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium the flag of Canada should hold the position of superior prominence, in the position of honour at the speaker's right as he/she faces the audience. Any other flag so displayed should be placed on the left of the speaker as he/she faces the audience.

Any flag should not be permitted to touch the ground as this is a sign of disrespect.
